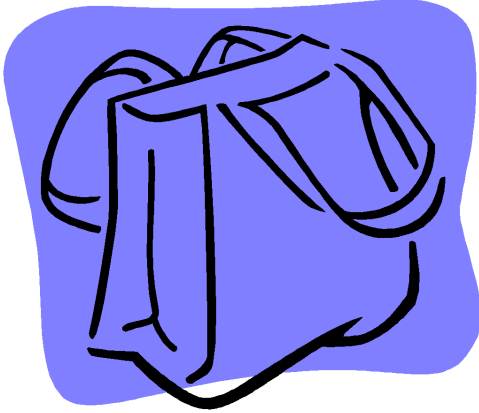

Author & Illustrator of Willie's ABC Day and Big J's ABC Day share their book writing experience.

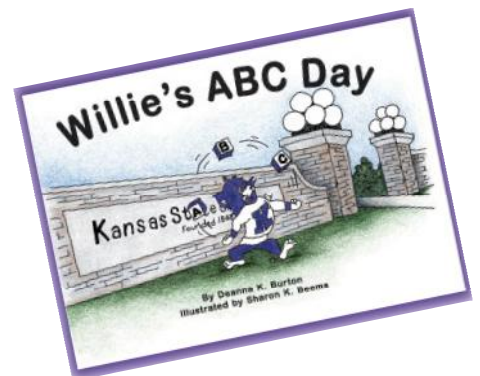
9:45-11:45 Add To Your Bag of Tricks with the following Presenters...
